<p>CED 104 - UNDERSTANDING PEOPLE</p> <p>An overview of the physical, psychological and spiritual development of men and women from birth through childhood, adolescence, young adulthood and maturity to the end of life. The focus of this course is upon the maturation processes, crises and vital choices inherent in each growth level with special emphasis on the effects on society and culture (majority/ minority) upon human development.</p>	<p>GEN 102 - BIBLE STUDY METHODS</p> <p>This course is to introduce the inductive Bible Study Method using three basic techniques: Observation, Interpretation and Application. Emphasis will be on rightly dividing the Word of God.</p>	<p>BIB 106- STUDY OF THE TABERNACLE</p> <p>This course presents a detailed study of the Tabernacle of Moses that was designed by God. It is an in-depth analogy of the construction, design and placement of all furniture pieces. The student will learn the significance of the types in the tabernacle and the Levitical Priesthood as it represents the Lord Jesus Christ.</p>
<p>MIS 202 - PERSONAL EVANGELISM</p> <p>This course examines methods of effective witnessing, it provides students with practical experience in recognizing evangelistic opportunities and determining appropriate approaches.</p>	<p>BIB 100 – OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY I</p> <p>A general review of the Old Testament canon. Attention is given to the outline and perspective of individual books and the history of their time.</p>	<p>THURSDAY, 6:00 p.m. - 8:45 p.m.</p> <p>BIB 102 - NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY</p> <p>An analysis of the New Testament books will be discussed, surmising its purpose, theme, author and date written. Special attention is given to the synoptic gospels.</p>
<p>MIN 500 – CHURCH ADMINISTRATION</p> <p>This course addresses the proper operation of the church and its related responsibilities. It examines legal concerns relative to the establishment and operation of the church, including leadership, organizational and protocol.</p>	<p>BIB 403 – DANIEL & REVELATION</p> <p>This course is a diligent inquiry into the circumstances of divinely appointed world empires, and a practical look at the “End Times.” Areas considered are the historical narratives of these prophetic books, as well as, the Tribulation, the return of the Jews, the Millennial Age and the time of the final judgment.</p>	<p>PSY 203 – MINISTRY AND CRISIS INTERVENTION</p> <p>This course explores Biblical principles relating to death, dying and other crisis. Students will discuss various points of view and cross-cultural attitude regarding these crises, facing death in a technological age, and being a survivor. Effective ministry to victims and survivors utilizing various social institutions will be examined.</p>
<p>THE 201 – PRINCIPLES OF THE APOSTOLIC DOCTRINE (APOSTOLICITY)</p> <p>This course gives special attention to the foundational tenets of the Apostolic Faith. It is an important course for those wishing to understand articulate the beliefs and concerns of the particular church movement.</p>	<p>HIS 100 – HISTORY OF PENTECOST</p> <p>A short history is given of the Pentecostal movement from the Apostolic to the modern era. The history of Pentecostal organizations and the lives of Pentecostal stalwarts are reviewed.</p>	<p>LAN 301 – NEW TESTAMENT GREEK I (Prerequisite: Old & New Testament)</p> <p>The student will learn to apply the principles of Greek syntax to various Greek texts. Students are provided with the tools needed to analyze the syntax of Greek New Testament. The course delves into translation of Biblical verses and applying the principles of syntax to the verses.</p>

MONDAY, 6:30 p.m. - 8:45 p.m.

CED 101 – RELATIONAL MASK

This class is designed to help the student have a deeper understanding of how they relate to God, self and others. Core beliefs are examined revealing the foundation of relational principles and character. The class explores eight (8) different masks that are used in relating to each other at the assets and deficiencies of each. These masks will be examined from a psychological (pertaining to self), sociological (pertaining to others), and spiritual (pertaining to God) lenses

STRATEGIES WORKSHOP FOR YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

This course is designed to give voice to youth’s real life issues and challenges from their perspective in today’s world.

CED 202 – SPIRITUAL GROWTH & MATURITY

This course teaches self-examination fundamentals to growth, development and maturity of the Christian life. It addresses communication and relationship with God and one’s fellow man.

HEALTHY LIVING EDUCATION

**6-week Certificated Course

This course is designed to educate and provide the skills to develop health-enhancing behavior change. During this 6-week course the students will examine the factors that affect their own health through bad eating habits. They will learn about the elements of an active approach to healthy living – an initiative that promotes healthy eating, an active lifestyle, and a positive self-image, as well as to encourage others to lead healthy lives.

**THE 205 - DISPENSATIONALISM
(3 Units)**

This course examines the biblical periods of time or Dispensations and their associated Covenants and Judgements. It illustrates dispensational theology by tracing God’s kingdom through history culminating with the millennial reign of Christ.

ENG 200 – INTRODUCTION TO COLLEGE WRITING

This course focuses on engaging students as writers and enhancing skills needed for success in a wide range of writing. Critical thinking, reading and research are integrated in this course along with interaction, discussions and feedback. An academic documentation style will be introduced.

**THE 402 - CHRISTIAN APOLOGETICS
(Prerequisite courses: Old and New Testament Survey)**

This course is a study of biblical, scientific, and foundational truths supporting defense of Christian faith in the midst of a pluralistic modern society.

BIB 107 – PRAYING THROUGH THE TABERNACLE

This course will present an in-depth study of praying through the pattern of the Tabernacle. Each part of the Tabernacle is a “shadow of heavenly things” (for example, the Altar of Sacrifice represents Repentance). Students will learn to pray through the tabernacle from the entrance right into the Holy of Holies.

CED 302 – CONFLICT RESOLUTION & FORGIVENESS

This class examines the concept of conflict. It assists the student in analyzing the nature of conflict and resolution. It also equips the student with positive principles for the redirecting or tension toward constructive ends.

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RECEIVE FREE TUITION FOR THE FIRST COURSE
